Town Hall

On Monday, I held a town hall in Wall Township, Congressman Chris Smith's district.

We spoke about several topics including the cuts to Medicaid proposed in the Republican budget, the ICE raids in our communities, and the lack of town halls by Republicans in Congress.



You can tell Republicans know that what they're up to in Washington is unpopular, because they continually refuse to make themselves available to their voters. But I'll tell you what, if they won't tell you what they're up to, I will.

Juneteenth

On Thursday, I had the honor of attending a flag-raising ceremony in Ewing to celebrate Juneteenth. And while we celebrated, we also recognized that justice has been too long delayed.

Next month our nation will mark 249 years of independence. But we've only had 160 years without slavery. That's 90 years in which the Black community lacked access to basic human rights while living in a country that claimed to be "free."



The truth is our country would not be free without the contributions of Black people. Black troops helped the Continental Army cross the Delaware and win crucial victories in Trenton and Princeton; victories that changed the course of the war. Black sailors and soldiers - slave and free - made up one-quarter of Washington's troops by the time the war ended.



I'm always glad for the opportunity to celebrate and recognize Black contributions to our national story. These stories must be told because this is not just Black history; it's fundamentally American history.

Preventing War with Iran

Whether or not to wage war is a prerogative of Congress—a power we have failed to assert for much of the past quarter-century. The consequence has been a series of foreign policy misadventures, endless wars, and prolonged global conflict.

Now, we see Trump trying to take us down the same path again. In response, I cosponsored a bipartisan bill with Rep. Thomas Massie (R-KY) and Rep. Ro Khanna (D-CA). This measure would reassert Congress's constitutional authority over when to declare war and require Congressional authorization for military action against Iran.
