In the News

Supreme Court Rulings

Birthright Citizenship

Today, the Supreme Court <u>issued a ruling</u> that prevents lower courts from blocking Trump's birthright citizenship executive order, but did not rule on the merits of the order itself. This is a shameful abdication of responsibility that thrusts millions of Americans into uncertainty and chaos.

I am confident that state leaders in New Jersey will promptly take action to protect our residents from this blatantly unconstitutional order, and I will continue to work to protect all New Jerseyans. No matter where you were born, no matter who your parents are, you are welcome in our state

Planned Parenthood Funding

When the Dobbs decision came down 3 years ago, many of us warned that the extreme right would be coming after contraception and women's healthcare next, sadly it looks like that prediction <u>may be coming true</u>.

Planned Parenthood is the only affordable place for many women to get physicals, cancer screenings, and contraception. This ruling paves the way for states to shut off healthcare for millions of women.

Future of Obamacare

Today, the Supreme Court issued a decision <u>preserving a key provision</u> of the Affordable Care Act (Obamacare). The provision is related to which preventative medical services are covered by ACA healthcare plans. Several courts had ruled that the panel of experts who determine which services are covered was itself unconstitutional. The Supreme Court disagreed, ensuring that — for now — the 150 million Americans who rely on the ACA for coverage can still receive preventative care.

Bombing Iran

This month, Trump <u>launched an unconstitutional attack</u> on Iran's nuclear facilities. The American people do not want yet another unnecessary war in the Middle East. Now, instead of preventing war, we risk getting involved in one - not for our security, but for the ego of two men who think they are above accountability.

The only viable path to lasting peace, and nuclear non-proliferation is through diplomacy. Brute force will only convince the Iranian regime that they need a nuclear weapon for their own defense. Recklessly attacking them only increases the chances they will construct a nuclear weapon in secret, <u>without IAEA inspections</u>, and without international oversight.

Democratic Caucus Task Force on Poverty

This month, I was proud to <u>announce</u> that I will be leading the House Democratic Caucus Task Force on Poverty. As the chair of the Task Force, I will continue to focus on helping working families meet their basic needs and fight back against the extreme budget cuts passed by House Republicans, which rip away programs that millions of Americans rely on.

I have always been guided by the belief that in the wealthiest country in the world we should establish a floor beneath which no person, no child, no family can fall. This task force is a continuation of this work.

ICE Agents Assault a Sitting U.S. Senator

This month, federal agents <u>assaulted a sitting U.S. Senator</u> in the state which he represents. Senator Alex Padilla was dragged out of a press conference for simply asking Secretary of Homeland Security Kristi Noem a question about one of her many lies.

Senator Padilla was escorted into the building by federal agents. The idea that they did

not know who he was is absurd. If they can do this in public, on camera, to a sitting U.S. Senator, just imagine what they do to ordinary folks trying just living their lives.

Legislation

PHARA

Earlier this month, I led 40 of my colleagues in <u>introducing legislation</u> to protect vital research being conducted by the National Institutes of Health (NIH). The Preventing Halting of Active Research Act (PHARA) would unfreeze and release funding for NIH contracts, prohibit termination of active research grants funding by the NIH, and reform termination clauses in grant contracts of the NIH.

SHADE Act

Earlier this week, as an oppressive heat wave settled on New Jersey, I introduced the SHADE Act, which would help plant trees in underserved communities. While this may seem like a superficial solution to a serious problem, there's more to it. A study conducted in 2019 found that almost all formerly redlined urban areas had higher land surface temperatures than non-redlined areas, due to reduced tree cover and increased asphalt or concrete surfaces. Redlined areas are on average 4.68°F warmer than in non-redlined areas, with discrepancies as high as 12.6°F having been measured between some neighborhoods. Planting trees not only makes our neighborhoods nicer to look at and more pleasant to stroll through, but it keeps our streets — and our neighbors — cooler.

Government Funding for FY26

Throughout June, the Appropriations Committee met for several marathon-sessions to consider government funding bills for the next fiscal year. Called "markups," these sessions are an opportunity for both sides to offer amendments, debate the funding provisions, and vote for or against the legislation before it is brought to the House floor.

I offered several amendments to different funding bills this month. One to stop a gag order on any mention of Critical Race Theory or "any related concept" in the Department of Agriculture; another to block funding cuts to FEMA's Emergency Food and Shelter program; and one to improve government efficiency by fully funding the Government Accountability Office, in addition to several others.

Unfortunately, my Republican colleagues elected to vote these down. I guess they don't want to help people impacted by natural disasters, they don't want researchers at the Department of Agriculture to acknowledge that race exists; and they actually don't want to improve government efficiency after all.
