1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3 SECTION 1. UNIFORM REQUIREMENTS FOR UNITED
4 STATES IMMIGRATION OFFICERS.
5 Section 287 of the Immigration and Nationality Act
6 (8 U.S.C. 1357) is amended by adding at the end the fol-

7 lowing:

1	"(h)(1) The Secretary of Homeland Security shall re-
2	quire covered immigration officers to identify themselves
3	as such officers by displaying bold and visible identifica-
4	tion during a time of action.
5	"(2) For the purposes of this subsection—
6	"(A) the term 'bold and visible identifica-
7	tion' means—
8	"(i) identification of the agency that
9	the covered immigration officer represents
10	no smaller than 12 inches by 6 inches on
11	the front or back of the uniform of such
12	officer; and
13	"(ii) the identification described under
14	clause (i) is not covered by external pieces
15	of a uniform, including external armor or
16	accessories;
17	"(B) the term 'covered immigration officer'
18	means—
19	"(i) personnel of the U.S. Customs
20	and Border Protection;
21	"(ii) personnel of the U.S. Immigra-
22	tion and Customs Enforcement; and
23	"(iii) any other official deputized by
24	the Secretary of Homeland Security to en-
25	gage in immigration enforcement actions.

1	"(C) the term 'time of action' includes any
2	immigration enforcement action such as a pa-
3	trol, raid, pickup, or serving a warrant.".
